Our Plan

The relevant government and health authorities continue to provide assurances that it is safe for students to attend school and that strict social distancing is not required for students. All students should attend school unless they are unwell. If any students show any signs of being sick, we ask that the student be kept at home until they are well again.

Minimising the risk of COVID @ SJPHS

- Enhanced cleaning Additional cleaning of toilets, bubblers and high touch areas
- •Enhanced hygiene practices Students will be asked to use hand sanitisers upon entering and leaving each class. Equipment will also be wiped.
- **BYOD** Students are encouraged to bring their own devices to support teaching and learning.
- Visitation on site Non-essential adults are not permitted on school grounds, excluding parents/carers for essential teacher meetings. Parents/carers will be contacted if their child is feeling unwell.
- Parent teacher phone interviews Information regarding how to book phone interviews went home at the end of last term. All semester 1 reports for Years 7-12 are available on the Student and Parent Portal. For support to access the portal, please contact the school on 9610 8035.
- **Sport and physical activity** School sport will return to normal.
- TAFE TAFE teaching and work placements will return to face-to-face
- School events Parents/carers are not permitted to attend school events and assemblies. Upcoming Year 12 activities are being reviewed in line with DOE guidelines and further information will be provided later in the term.

Allied Health Support at School

St Johns Park High School has been working closely with team members from Allied Health Partnerships for a long time. Their service at our school is valued and aimed at creating a pathway of success for our students! Here is how they are helping us.

In addition to your School Counsellor and School Psychologist, we have a Psychologist available every Friday if students feel like they need to speak to someone. Psychologists work to help people learn about and manage their feelings and behaviours during difficult times. They also work with people who may be diagnosed with specific mental health issues.

Your Allied Health Partnerships Psychologist is Amanda LeRoy and she is able to work with students who might be experiencing anxious thoughts about school or home, HSC preparation and finishing High School. She can also help with difficult thoughts about how you might see yourself, but also how you manage relationships with other people.

If you would like to see the Psychologist, even if it's just for a short time to help with a specific situation, speak to your Deputy or Year Advisor to start the process.

We also partner with a Speech Pathologist, Occupational Therapists and Dietitian to assist our students through Allied Health Partnerships.

Speech Pathologists work with people who are experiencing language difficulties and have difficulties with: Oral and reading comprehension, written and verbal expression, learning new words, learning social skills and how to regulate emotions.

Occupational Therapists enable people to participate in the activities of everyday life. They achieve this by helping people to do things that will enhance their ability to participate in an activity or by modifying the environment to better support their participation. School based Occupational Therapists often work on goals such as fine and gross motor skills, handwriting and emotional regulation.

The Dietitian is able to work with students to provide education about food choices in order to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Learning about how to make healthy food choices can affect how you perform at school, in sports and at work.

If you would like to use any of these services, speak to your Year Advisor or Deputy Principal and they will be able to organise this for you!


