Vaccinations at SJPHS

As you are aware due to COVID 19, the 2020 Year 7 school program school clinics were suspended at the beginning of 2020 and then resumed after June. The students at St Johns Park High School had their vaccination on Friday 11th September 2020. The required interval between HPV- Gardasil 9 dose 1 and dose 2 is 6 months.

Therefore, all Year 7 students who were given HPV – Gardasil Dose 1 from June 2020 onwards will be offered HPV – Gardasil – dose 2 during Term 1, 2021.

There is no need for parents to take their children to the GP as all outstanding 2020 Year 7 vaccinations will be caught up through the school immunisation program in 2021.

If your Year 7 child missed their vaccination, please send the completed consent form to school, and they will receive their first vaccine in 2021.

HSC Student Advice

We know our students and staff have worked hard for the HSC. The safety of our students and staff remains of utmost importance. This year, extra arrangements are in place to ensure that any disruption due to COVID-19 will have minimal impact on HSC exams.

Our school has put in place a number of contingencies to help ensure exams run as smoothly as possible.

The exams have been scheduled and our school has arrangements in place for exams to proceed as planned. It is important that students review their timetable and plan well so they turn up for their exams on time, healthy and rested.

Any student with a pre-existing condition that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms, should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide a medical certificate ahead of the exams to ensure they are not sent home.

If on the day of the exam, your child feels unwell with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home and get tested. HSC students are prioritised for COVID-19 test results.

It's important to note that all students will be asked if they are well before entering exam rooms.

We want all our students to sit their exams but sometimes things happen. If your child is unwell and misses their exam, contact the school. Students who are unwell will be eligible for the <u>illness and misadventure</u> provision with NESA.

If there are any changes to exam arrangements , we will communicate with the HSC students through **stjohnspk-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au** or **02 9610 8035**. This will be the <u>only source of communication</u> for these types of notifications. If in doubt, please call the school.

Vaping / Electronic Cigarettes

What are vapes/e-cigarettes?

Vapes/ e-cigarettes are battery-operated devices that resemble tobacco cigarettes, heating liquids such as nicotine, flavourings and other chemicals to produce a vapour that users inhale. Liquids used in these devices varies across a range of chemicals and may or may not contain nicotine.

Vapes/e-cigarettes are often shaped and coloured to look like everyday items such as pens or USB memory sticks.

These devices can be purchased online or at tobacconists and can also be obtained from people supplying kids with vapes in shopping centres and parks.

In recent studies, there has been an increasing number of teenagers using these devices that contain nicotine which is highly addictive.

Our school action

At St Johns Park High School, we continue to implement a "no smoking" policy to our students.

All students have been briefed on the dangers of using vapes/ e-cigarettes. Students have also been educated about the dangers of using tobacco products in PDHPE class as part of the school curriculum.

Our staff are prompted to be vigilant and are reporting any behaviours that indicate a student is involved in this type of activity.

The Effects

- Increased risk of developing respiratory and cardiovascular diseases.
- Growing evidence that e-cigarette use is a precursor to smoking in young people.
- Nicotine can increase the risk for future addictions to other drugs.
- Nicotine can cause harm to parts of the brain that control attention, learning and mood and has the potential to delay the brain development of an adolescent.

The well-being and safety of our students is our priority as we aim to provide a safe and supportive learning environment where every student is known, valued and cared for.

We are encouraging parents and carers to have conversations with their child(ren) about the consequences of these devices.
