Attendance

At St Johns Park High School, we and the community believe that attendance is central to all academic and welfare issues. The responsibility for encouraging and monitoring high standards of attendance and punctuality is shared amongst the whole school community including staff, students and care providers. Students must maintain a school attendance report over **90%**. Year Advisors will interview students and/or call home for any students with low attendance and continue to monitor students.


Leadership by the Cowpasture






