Financial Support After High School

Financial Support After High School

Services Australia has payments available to support Year 12 students with further study or training after high school. This includes if you are going on to university, TAFE or starting an apprenticeship.

The main payments are **Youth Allowance** for students and Australian Apprentices and **ABSTUDY**. There is also Youth Allowance for job seekers if you are looking for work or studying part time.

The Services Australia website can help you learn more about these payments and how to claim. You can use the Services Australia <u>Payment and Service Finder</u> to get an estimate of how much your fortnightly payment could be.

Claim a payment using a Centrelink online account linked to myGov. Even if you haven't been accepted into your course, claim up to 13 weeks before your course starts. That way you're more likely to have your payment when you need it. You can update your course later, if you need to.

There are other payments for students who move away from regional and remote areas for study. These include a one-off payment of up to \$5,000 for students going straight to tertiary study without a gap year.

Engineering Excursion - UOW Tour and MyneSight

The Year 12 Engineering excursion was very eye opening as we got to visit the prestigious University of Wollongong. When arriving we were greeted by members of the university and shown to the presentation room. We listened for half an hour to a mining engineering lecturer talk about the many opportunities that the field of mining engineering has to offer, as well as how UOW is encouraging students to take interest and succeed in this field.

We were also given the chance to do a fun and interesting activity utilising virtual reality. We first had to perform some calculations regarding the VR scenario, which was an investigation into the reason why there was too much carbon dioxide built up in a certain tunnel of a mine. During the activity, we discovered the reason for the build up was an accident involving a vehicle and barrel that caught on fire, which used up all the oxygen and released dangerous levels of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. After completing the task, the staff gave us a tour of the various engineering building which showed us the different fields of engineering and what engineers get to use as part of their day to day research on campus.

We then moved on to the second part of the excursion where we visited an artificial mine site. On arrival we were required to wear standardised mine site equipment such as a specialised belt that included an emergency breathing apparatus and batteries for our headlight. Next we were given an in depth look of all the mine site mechanical equipment, processes and jobs related to creating a mine. The instructors then separated us in two groups where we completed two activities. The first activity allowed us to experience the atmosphere of being in a mine tunnel and building the supports using teamwork and communication. The second activity showed the procedure of using a high pressure fire hose. The key ideas of both activities was to display the importance of communication on work sites such as in a mine.
