All Year 7 students also learned about biomimicry, geometry, probability and art to create their Lumis using mathematical engineering. Senior Subject Selection

Year 10 students have been involved in a program of events to assist them in making considered and informed choices about their future and senior subjects for 2024. We were extremely proud of our students and the professional and mature approach they have taken to all of these events.

Parents and students were involved in the Subject Selection Information Evening early on in the term. They were presented with important information from NESA and UAC, including HSC requirements, eligibility, the RoSA credential and the ATAR. The night was a great success with a huge turn out of Year 10 families.

Students also participated in a Subject Selection Fair where they were involved in a number of workshops around curriculum and subjects to be offered. We saw students immersed in their workshops with the majority of students saying they found the day beneficial to them.

To finalise the events, students participated in Senior Interview Day last week. The interviews provided students with an opportunity to clarify their goals and to discuss on an individual basis their senior subject selection. We were extremely proud of Year 10 in the professional manner in which they dressed and were prepared for the interview day. We were also impressed with the study patterns that most of our students have made; they reflect clear thought and careful consideration of their options.

We look forward to Year 10 becoming senior students during our EX-10-SION program.

Year 9 Elective Subject Selection for 2024

Our Year 8 students have some important decisions to make over the next few weeks in regards to their elective subject selection choices for 2024. Students were issued with an individual webcode to select their elective subjects for next year and an Elective subject selection Handbook which guides students through the process and gives an outline of the courses available with their associated costs.

Year 8 will have the choice of two electives from a broad selection. Electives have been introduced to provide students with some choice in their curriculum.

Students have until 8:00 am Friday 8 September, 2023 (Week 8) to consider their elective choices, discuss these with parents/carers and teachers and complete the online selection process. Students are required to return a printed copy of the subject selection form, signed by parents/carers to the front office.



Well done Year 10! We look forward to seeing you grow as senior students at St Johns Park High School!
























UNSW Gateway Spring Program



Celebrating Education, NAIDOC and Book Week 2023

Our teachers incorporated special lessons into their week for students to engage and learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and their culture and history as part of our celebrations.

Year 7 students enthusiastically explored the origins, purpose and mechanics of boomerangs in an engaging lesson. Students enjoyed trying their hand at throwing boomerangs in the school oval with some successfully experiencing the satisfying return of the ancient tools. This practical engagement not only deepened their understanding of indigenous cultures but also imparted a memorable experience.

The picture book, 'Let the Children Go' written by Archie Roach explores the experiences of the Stolen Generation. As part of NAIDOC week, 8R students created a visual representation of a chosen page in the book, deepening their understanding of the Stolen Generation and its continuing impact.

Year 8 Visual Arts students re-created their journey from home to school using traditional Aboriginal symbols. This will be transferred into a painting using traditional colour schemes in acrylic paint.


Year 8 Technology students explored the textile fabric designs of Babbarra Women's Centre in Arnhem Land. Using their traditional indigenous symbols research, students tried to interpret the meanings behind their chosen designer's art. Students then began to develop their own design featuring their Yarning Circle.

The theme was 'The first Australians were also the first farmers'. Year 10 Agriculture students presented the history, culture and achievements of the Aboriginal people. Students highlighted the history of agriculture before 1744 with respect to Aboriginal practices including land, water animals and plants.

During their English lesson, JLS explored the Dreamtime story of the 'Emu in the Sky'. Through this activity, students were able to improve their comprehension skills and strengthen their understanding of Aboriginal culture. Students concluded the lesson by rendering a drawing of an emu.

OLS1/OALS1 investigated the properties and uses of lemon myrtle, an Australian native plant. Students completed a cooking lesson, making banana bread where lemon myrtle was a key ingredient.




