Providing a safe and supportive environment for students

The welfare of the students at St Johns Park High School is one of our highest priorities. Students who feel they are supported, respected, and appreciated, have positive self-esteem and a sense of positive wellbeing. We want our students to feel supported, appreciated, and rewarded for their successes. Every staff member at St Johns Park High School plays a role in the welfare of our students. Our Office Staff are often the first 'port of call' for our parents when they contact the school, and these staff members find the best person to help your child.

In 2023, we welcome Ms Taylor Davies to our staff as Head Teacher Student Wellbeing, to enhance and grow our already good student welfare procedures. Ms Davies comes with a wealth of knowledge and experiences which will benefit our students.

Year Advisors

Each year group has two Year Advisors to care for the needs of students. Any information which will affect the student's ability to participate in school should be directed to the Year Advisors. The Year Advisors at St Johns Park High School are all dedicated and excellent classroom teachers who have a special affinity with their students' wellbeing and want to enhance their experiences at school.

The Year Advisors care for their student's educational, physical, emotional, and social wellbeing. They organise School Camps and/or Welfare Days for their year to address areas of need or interest to the year group. These days can include performances, presentations, and role-plays. They organise Incentive Day which rewards the outstanding efforts of our students. Students who achieve Level 4 & 5 in the Level System and have not moved to level 2, are invited to the Incentive Day, where students spend the day at Raging Waters with the costs being subsidised by the school.

School Counsellors

In addition to the Year Advisors, St Johns Park High School has School Counsellors most days a week - **Mr Ruslan Epoff** is our regular School Counsellor, and our Senior School Psychologist is **Ms Adriana Fallone**.

Allied Health Professionals

St Johns Park High School employs specialist allied health professionals: Art Therapists; Speech Pathologists, Dietitian, and Occupational Therapists.

Speech Pathologists work with teenagers with language difficulties, oral and reading comprehension issues, written expression, learning new words and the hidden curriculum. Most teenagers with language disorders are expected to cope with the mainstream curriculum.

Occupational Therapists (OTs) enable people to participate in the activities of everyday life. They achieve this by enabling/teaching people to do things that will enhance their ability to participate in the activity or by modifying the environment to better support their participation. School-based occupational therapists are concerned with assisting children and adolescents through various interventions to succeed in their role as a student.

Dietitians work with individuals and groups of students around healthy eating choices, and how this effects student wellbeing and long term health, and academic performance.

Our Art Therapist - **Pensri Rowe**, works with students from all year groups, either as individuals or in groups. The students use art as a therapeutic tool to discuss issues concerning their wellbeing, feelings, and peer relationships, in a non-judgemental and safe environment.

These therapists work with individuals and small groups of students to help improve the student's learning and emotional resilience. Referral to these therapists can be by parents/caregivers, teachers, the Learning & Support Team or by the student themselves.

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Changes to Day Structure

St Johns Park High School has reviewed its curriculum and learning programs. Following consultation through meetings, surveys and focus groups with staff, community and students, we are delighted to announce a new learning structure that will provide greater flexibility in how we deliver learning programs while meeting mandatory NESA and Department of Education curriculum hours.

The new learning structure includes:

- A **non-school day** for senior students. The timetable for Years 11 and 12 will be compacted to a **9-day cycle**. Students will have every **Wednesday Week B** as a non-school day. Students will be able to undertake paid work, volunteering, apprenticeships, work experience, private study, major works and/or pay more attention to their health, wellbeing and fitness.
- Year 7 to 10 will have **ONE** early finish in the fortnight at **1:30 pm** (Wednesday Week B).
- On the early finish day (Wednesday Week B), supervision will remain onsite for those students who are unable to get home safely before the end of the **normal school day at 2:50 pm**.
- **Professional learning** time for teachers to support curriculum reform implementation and school priorities. This will take place Wednesday Week B from 1:40 pm.

The changes will **NOT** affect:

- School start time remains at 8:30 am and school finish time remains at 2:50 pm.
- Break times - 2x30 minute breaks will remain at recess and lunch, with students having access to the school canteen each day.
- 2-week cycle (Week A/Week B), each day having 4 periods with the exception if Wednesday Week B, which will have 3 periods.
- Semesterised subjects—History/Geography (Years 7 to 10) and Music/Visual Arts (Years 7 and 8)

Student Vaccinations

Student Vaccinations

St Johns Park High School works with NSW Health to provide vaccines that are recommended for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC). The routine school vaccination program for students in Year 7 and Year 10, is offering online consent from 2023.

In **Year 7**, students are offered the vaccines for:

- Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa)
- Human papillomavirus (HPV).

In **Year 10**, students are offered the vaccine for:

- Meningococcal ACWY

To provide online consent you will need:

- The link provided by our school
- Your Service NSW log-in details
- Medicare card details for you and your child

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, consent can still be provided by requesting a paper-based consent form directly from our school.

Parents/carers can provide consent online for their child's routine school vaccinations on the online consent portal, [here](#).

By providing consent for your child's vaccination online, you can:

- easily update your child's details
- get SMS and/or email notifications when your child has received their vaccinations
- more quickly see their vaccination records on the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR).

Parent Information About Mobile Phones

Appropriate Use of Mobile Phones at St Johns Park High School

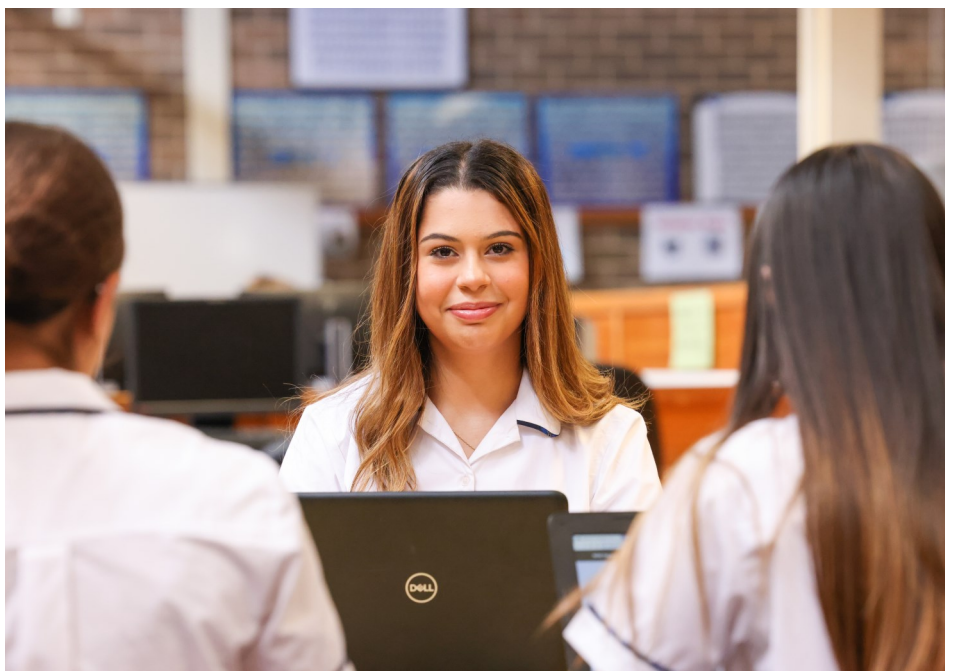
The great majority of our students use their mobile phones sensibly and appropriately. However, when phones are used inappropriately issues do arise. This year, in line with most schools and best practices, we are implementing important changes to our mobile phone policy.

When used appropriately, mobile phones offer students, their parents/carers and staff advantages in terms of ease of communication and a sense of personal safety. However, mobile phones also have the capacity to impact negatively on the learning environment and on the safety and well-being of students. The inappropriate use of mobile phones has resulted in bullying and harassment, the distribution of inappropriate content, the disruption of lessons and fundamentally has the capacity to generate substantial barriers to student engagement and learning.

As a result, St Johns Park High School has established guidelines and procedures to support students, staff and parents/carers in developing appropriate safe, responsible and respectful ways to use student mobile phones, airpods/headphones and smart watches. All these devices will need to be **'switched off and out of sight'** during class or during any educational activity. Phones must not be seen or heard during class and lessons. Students must ensure that mobile phones, earphones/airpods and smart watches are placed in their school bags and turned off before entering the classroom.

However at this point, students are allowed to access and use mobile phones, airpods/headphones and smart watches during their breaks. Students may also use their mobile phones **when permitted and instructed by the teacher** responsible for conducting the lesson or event to support learning within the classroom.

If your child needs to contact you, they can do so through the Front Office. Likewise, if you need to get a message to your child, you can call us on **9610 8035**. In the event of an emergency, a message will be sent to families as soon as possible. For this reason please ensure you notify the school when changes are made to your contact details. We ask all our parents and guardians to work with us as we implement this new process throughout the year. Thank you for your continued support. Parent Information About Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are to be **"SWITCHED OFF & OUT OF SIGHT"**

1st Offence

- If a mobile phone, airpods/headphones or smart watch is seen and/or heard during class time, the teacher will warn the student and ask the student to switch the item off and place it in their school bag
- First warning to be documented by the teacher in Sentral (notifying the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group and the Head Teacher)
- If the student does not follow the teacher's request, the student will be sent to the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group with an 'Out of Class' slip specifying the reason

2nd Offence

- The student will be sent to the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group with an 'Out of Class' slip
- The Deputy Principal will confiscate the student's mobile phone, airpods/headphones or smart watch and store the item safely and securely in their office
- Second warning to be documented by the teacher in Sentral (notifying the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group and the Head Teacher)
- The Deputy Principal will call the parent/carer of the student to inform them of the confiscation and to warn them that a second confiscation will result in the parent/carer having to come to school to collect the item

3rd Offence

- The student will be sent to the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group with an 'Out of Class' slip
- The Deputy Principal will confiscate the student's mobile phone, airpods/headphones or smart watch and store the item safely and securely in their office
- The Deputy Principal will call the parent/carer of the student to inform them that a second confiscation has occurred and that they are required to come to the school to collect the item. The parent/carer will also be informed that their child will be issued with a 'Formal Warning of Suspension' for continued disobedience
- Third warning to be documented by the Deputy Principal in Sentral (notifying the teacher and the Head Teacher)

4th Offence

Possible Consequences:

- Student may be suspended due to continual disobedience
- Student may be banned from bringing their mobile phone to school for a two-week period
- Student may be required to submit their mobile phone to the Deputy Principal responsible for that year group at the start of the school day for a specified period of time



School Uniform Policy

School Uniform

At St Johns Park High School, we believe wearing school uniform supports our learning and enhances the safety of all students. A uniform promotes a sense of belonging for students, builds a strong school spirit and creates a positive identity for the school community. Students are required to wear full school uniform every day to school, including between school and home and when engaged in school activities. The school uniform information, including the 2023 uniform price list can be found on our school website, [here](#).

Sport uniform is only to be worn to school on the following allocated Sports Days:

- **Year 7 and 8** - Thursdays
- **Year 9** - Wednesdays
- **Year 10** - Mondays
- **Years 11 and 12** - No sports uniform

If a student has a Physical Education (PE) class or a practical Physical Activity and Sport Studies (PASS), Gifted Athletics Program (GAP), Dance, Sports Academy or Sports, Lifestyle and Recreation Studies (SLR) class during the day, they are expected to wear their school uniform to school and change for their lesson. After the lesson, students are expected to change back into their full school uniform.

If a student is out of uniform for any reason they are required to bring a signed note from home and see their supervising DP in the morning before 8.20am.

As part of our work, health and safety guidelines, students must wear black fully enclosed leather shoes to school each day. Students may be excluded from classes that require this type of footwear, including subjects in Industrial Arts, Home Economics, Science and Visual Arts.

The uniform shop is maintained by our Office staff and is located onsite in B block where all items of school uniform can be collected. It is open Monday to Wednesday before school from 8.00am – 8.30am for students to collect uniform. Parents can purchase uniforms online via our school website, alternatively, students are able to pay for their uniform at the Office, with either cash or EFTPOS.

The wearing of school uniform is strictly enforced and students will receive consequences if they are consistently out of uniform.

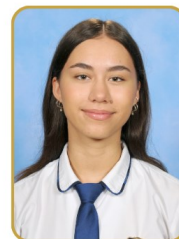

After-school Study Hub

Our Study Hub program offers students a supervised facility where they can complete their classwork, homework, research and assignments. 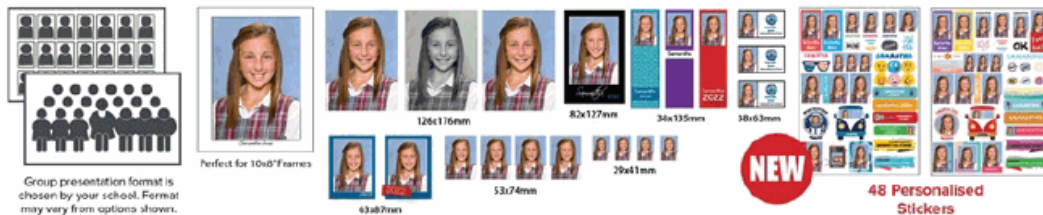
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School Photos

STEP 1

STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available



cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography.
Please note this delivery timeframe is dependant on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.

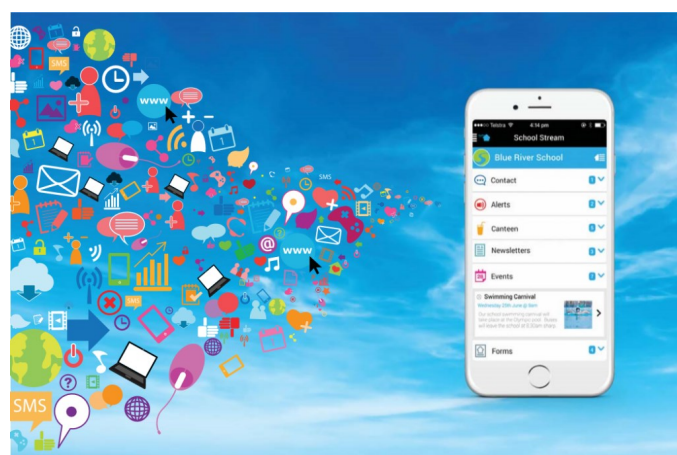
