Students learned about Sustainability, Electric Circuit, Letter Writing skills, United Nations Sustainability Goals and Energy Poverty. The student assembled solar lights will be delivered to children in energy poor countries to light up their world. All Year 7 students also learned about biomimicry, geometry, probability and art to create their Lumis using mathematical engineering. These illuminating lights were displayed to represent Aboriginal Astronomy at our Parent Teacher Interviews earlier this term.

Our Parent Teacher Evening was also a great success. There was a clear increase in the number of parents attending the evening in support of their children. Thank you to Deputy Principal Nicole Sullivan who worked tirelessly in the background, setting up the parent portal and organising the interview times on Sentral for parents and staff as well as distributing all relevant information to the community.

I am also very proud of our Year 12 students who have just completed their HSC Trial Examinations. 



Classroom Feature - Year 7 Geography

Year 7 students explored the cultural and spiritual values of landforms. Using the context of the Three Sisters (Katoomba, Blue Mountains), students learned of the Aboriginal Dream Time story of the creation of the Three Sisters, and created their own visual interpretations.















Classroom Feature - Year 7 PDHPE

Year 7 Students participated in a selection of games and activities passed down through generations, from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities throughout Australia. The games provided our students with an opportunity to learn about, appreciate and experience aspects of Indigenous culture.

Students in 7P played a game of 'Buroinjin'. This was a ball game played by the Kabi Kabi people of South Queensland. The game was played with a ball made of kangaroo skin, called a buroinjin. The traditional ball, which was smaller than a soccer ball, was sewn with tendons and stuffed with grass. The game was often played until sunset and spectators used to mark their applause by calling out 'Ei, ei'. In place of the buroinjin, our students played with a European handball. During the lesson, our students were also encouraged to applaud positive play by calling out 'Ei, ei'. Well done 7P!













Classroom Feature - Year 8 Agriculture

Students were involved in creating and presenting information about Bush Tucker Gardens through their poster that they designed. Students provided definitions and examples of what bush tucker is and the medicinal and food uses of bush tucker.























Celebrating Book Week

Classroom Feature - Year 8 Visual Arts

Referring to the agreed symbols of the Central Western Desert Art (Papunya 'Dot' style painting), students in 8VA4 created personal symbols to represent objects, spaces, and individuals they experience on their journey to school. Students used these symbols to develop a painting or collagraph image which incorporates traditional ochre colours and the dot symbols characteristic of the style.

Classroom Feature - Year 9 Home Economics

As part of the Food in Australia unit, students have been learning about the history of food in Australia. Students have acquired cultural knowledge of Australia's First People by researching native Australian bush food, looking at traditional hunting, gathering and cooking techniques and are now designing bush food infused meals. Students enjoyed cooking kangaroo sausages for their first practical and have made damper infused with wattle seeds along with a bush tomato, mountain pepper and pepperberries dip.
