Assessments

Assessments are a vital component of the teaching and learning process. Assessment tasks or assignments are learning activities designed to gather information about a student's level of knowledge and understanding. This information is then evaluated against the learning outcomes for each subject. This process is particularly important for monitoring student progress and helps gather information about their learning, enabling goal-setting for future learning. Assessment tasks may include examinations, research projects, or in-class practical activities.

Students must ensure they:

- Make a serious attempt and complete all parts of the task
- Submit assessment tasks by the due date as penalties apply for late submissions
- Submit the task directly to their teacher, and not rely on friends or leave it on the teacher's desk
- Keep a copy of the assessment in case the original is misplaced
- Provide a medical certificate if absent on the day an assessment task is due. (Complete Illness/Misadventure form if in Years 10, 11, or 12)
- Complete Illness/Misadventure form and consult their teacher if they have VET Work Placement, TAFE, or other school commitments on the day of the task to make alternative arrangements

Children's Online Privacy Code

Children's Online Privacy Code

The Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC), the Australian Government's privacy regulator, is seeking input from parents and carers to assist them in its development of the Children's Online Privacy Code.

The Code will put children at the centre of privacy protections in Australia. By the time a child turns 13, it's estimated that 72 million pieces of data will have been collected about them. The aim of the Code is to strengthen privacy protections for the handling of children's personal information.

Your insights as a parent or carer are important. To have your say, please take a few minutes to complete the parent discussion paper, <u>here</u>. Your support is also important in helping your child or young person to take part too. Please assist them in filling out the appropriate worksheet, provided in the link above.


