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Subjects Studied in Year 7

Year 7 students participate in a variety of familiar and new subjects taught by subject specialists. All Year 7 students are taught from syllabuses developed by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). Mandatory curriculum requirements and subjects that all Year 7 students will be studying include:

- **English**
- Mathematics
- Science
- Human Society and Its Environment (Geography and History)
- Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE)
- Planned Physical Activity (Sport).
- **Technology Mandatory**
- Music
- Visual Arts
- Language (Italian)

Homework, Study and Assessment Tasks

Homework will vary in amount and type because of the number of teachers and subjects each day. Most students will need to do some homework every night. It might be a review of the day's lesson, completion of exercises or starting an assignment that is due later on.

Study time is different from homework. During study time, students should go over the day's work, read their textbooks or notes, create summaries and try to increase their understanding of concepts covered in class. There is no one 'best' way to study. Students often find different methods and times to study to suit themselves. The key is regular study, not cramming before a test or exam.

Assessment tasks or assignments are a learning activity designed to collect information about your level of knowledge and understanding. This information is then measured against learning outcomes for each subject. This is collected across the semester (Term 1 and 2 or Term 3 and 4) and the year to give you a mark, grade and rank which you can read on your school report. Assessment tasks might include an exam, research task or in class practical task. Students in high school should regularly review work covered in class, summarise key ideas and do additional reading and research on topics, as well as practise tasks such as essays and maths problems.

SJPHS School Assessment Requirements

Assessment is an integral part of the teaching and learning process. It provides an opportunity for students to gather information about their learning and set goals for future learning. Assessment Can enhance student engagement and motivation, particularly when it incorporates interaction with teachers, other students and a range of resources.

This booklet includes a breakdown of the formal assessment tasks that all students will be required to complete. Students will also be given formative tasks that do not appear in this booklet that they will be required to complete. They contribute to students' ability to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding just as much as formal tasks. The Years 7-10 syllabuses advocate assessment for learning, and these tasks are important to the development of student awareness about their progress.

Assessment task requirements

St Johns Park High School is committed to developing quality assessment tasks. All assessment task includes:

- Details of the task
- Due date (with at least 2 weeks notice)
- Method of submission online and/or a printed hard copy
- Criteria of the task (requirements)
- Outcomes assessed
- Marking criteria or Rubric

Student responsibilities

- Make a serious attempt and give your best effort in the assessment task
- Complete all parts of the task
- Submit your assessment tasks by the due date. Penalties apply for late submissions
- If you are absent on the day an assessment task is due, bring a signed note from your parent/carer explaining your absence and submit it to the office. If possible, provide a medical certificate
- Submit your assessment task directly to your teacher. Do not rely on friends or left on teacher's desks.
- Keep a copy of your assessment in case the original is misplaced
- Ensure arrangements have been made if there is an excursion organised the same day as your assessment task is due.

Teacher responsibilities

- Ensure assessment tasks adhere to subject requirements and align to syllabus outcomes
- Provide students with a written assessment task notification with at least 2 weeks notice
- Support students with information relevant to the completion of the task
- Make reasonable adjustments for students including writing scaffolds or timelines for task completion
- Mark and provide feedback to all assessment tasks in a timely manner
- Collate and maintain assessment marks and related information during the course

Honesty in assessment

All work presented in assessment tasks and exams must be your own work or acknowledged appropriately. Malpractice including plagiarism could lead to a student receiving a zero mark. Malpractice includes:

- Copying someone else's work in part of whole and presenting it as your own
- Using materials directly from books or the internet without reference to the source (see next page referencing information)
- Buying, stealing, borrowing or using Artificial Intelligence
- Paying someone else to write or prepare materials

Parents will be notified if a student is suspected of malpractice.

Absence from an assessment task

Reason for absence	What the student must do	Course of action
I am sick on the day an assessment task is due	On the first day that you return to school, submit the assessment task- even if you do not have that class. Bring a signed parent letter that explains your absence to the front office. If you	Your teacher will mark your assessment task without penalty.
I am sick on the day of an exam	went to the Doctor, you can include a medical certificate. Inform your teacher that the note has been submitted.	Your teacher will negotiate an alternative time.
I cannot attend school due to an unforeseen reason eg. Funeral	On the first day that you return to school, bring a signed parent letter that explains your absence to the front office.	Your teacher will negotiate an alternative time to complete the task depending on the nature and amount of leave.

Late submissions of an assessment task

If you have a valid reason for needing an extension of time to complete an assessment task, you must see your teacher **before the task is due**.

If you submit an assessment task late #, there may be penalties. There are as follows for Year 7 and 8:

Penalty details	Amount deducted
Assessment task submitted 1 day late*	20% of assessable mark
Assessment task submitted 2 days late*	40% of assessable mark
Assessment task submitted 3 days late*	60% of assessable mark
Assessment task submitted 4 days late*	80% of assessable mark
Assessment task submitted 5 days late (1 week)*	Zero marks awarded

How to reference information

All sources from where you gather information should be listed in a Reference at the end of your assessment task. Sometimes a Reference list is referred to as a Bibliography. St Johns Park High School encourages students to use the APA text referencing system. Examples of referencing are below:

Referencing a website -

Name of Site. Date the site was last updated. Name of page accessed. Weblink. Date you accessed the site.

Referencing a book -

Stage 4 Assessment Schedules 2024

Course Assessment Schedules provide students with the general nature and timing of formal tasks. Students are issued with the assessment schedule at the commencement of the Year 7 course. Students are expected to complete **all** tasks which are part of the assessment program in each course of study.

In exceptionally rare circumstances a change to the assessment schedule may need to be made. The Head Teacher of the course, will inform all students affected in writing of the change. Sufficient time will be given to students to complete their work by the new due date/s. All care will be taken to minimise clashes and heavy work load periods, but this cannot always be guaranteed.

Assessment schedules for each course set out the timing of each task. Course teachers will advise, in writing, the precise timing and nature of the task at least two weeks before the task is to be administered or is due. It is the student's responsibility to be alert to the notification and due date of tasks by reference to the Assessment Schedule. If uncertain about a task, students should communicate directly with their Course Teacher or the Course Head Teacher.
