Academic

Scholarships

Academic scholarships are awarded based on academic results, school reports, an interview and may include the submission of an academic portfolio and supporting documents.

Academic scholarships are awarded for up to 100% of school fees and include the recipient receiving a laptop. There will be additional charges for excursions, tours, camps etc. These charges are payable by parents/carers and do not form part of the scholarship. For 2021, applications will be accepted from every year group and last the duration of each Stage. This is outlined as follows:

From 2022, all students will be able to apply for a scholarship at the beginning of each stage ie. Years 7, 9 and 11. Previous scholarship recipients are able to reapply.

Prerequisites

The student must have achieved outstanding academic results and displayed commitment to, and involvement in their current school.

Application Process

Students are to present a **1-page submission** outlining why they are a suitable candidate for an Academic Scholarship. This should be accompanied with supporting documents, including the most current school academic report. Selected applicants may be invited to undertake an interview with members of the Scholarship Committee.

Scholarship Obligations

Scholarship recipients are expected to maintain high standards in both academic performance and co-curricular activities. Recipients are expected to meet with their Year Advisor to discuss their academic progress at the half waypoint and completion of each school year.

Eligible applicants

- Students in Year 6, entering Year 7 2021 at St Johns Park High School
- Students currently enrolled in Year 8 to 11 2021
- Students in Mainstream and Special Education
- External applicants seeking enrolment at St Johns Park High School



Strive for Excellence Scholarships

Strive for Excellence scholarships are awarded based on attendance, outstanding commitment to, and involvement in school life and the wider community.

Strive for Excellence scholarships are awarded for up to 100% of school fees and include the recipient receiving a laptop. There will be additional charges for excursions, tours, camps etc. These charges are payable by parents/carers and do not form part of the scholarship.

In 2021, Strive for Excellence Scholarships will be awarded to students in Years 7 to 12 and last the duration of the year. They are awarded in the following areas:

- Sport
- Performance Music, Art and Drama
- Students from various cultural backgrounds including Indigenous and those who are refugees
- Community Service and Citizenship
- Any other area where students demonstrate the perusal of excellence in their chosen field

Prerequisites

The student must have displayed commitment to, and involvement in their current school.

Application Process

Students are to present a **1-page submission** outlining why they are a suitable candidate for a Strive for Excellence Scholarship. This should be accompanied with supporting documents, including the most current school academic report. Selected applicants may be invited to undertake an interview with members of the Scholarship Committee.
